2WAYS is a groundbreaking science communication project to increase the dialogue and public knowledge regarding European life science research.

EUSCEA 2WAYS SCIENCE FESTIVAL Teams of events and research institutions have created 17 presentations of European life science research projects. More than 60 universities, research centres and science event organisers have participated. YOUNG EUROPEANS SCIENCE PARLIAMENT Science parliaments for young students have been organised in 29 cities around Europe. From each parliament, two students have been elected to come to the first Young Europeans Science Parliament in Brussels, to discuss the use of stem cells, access to genetic information and personalised medicine

IMPACT STUDY 6,500 visitors to science events have answered an impact study survey, partly based on the same questions as the Eurobarometer.

BRUSSELS is the logical venue of the final event and activities. The project is funded by the European Union, most of the research projects too. The Young Europeans Science Parliament's resolutions will be handed over to the European Parliament.
